

Youth-led ventures reshape tourism in Jabal Akhdar

High above the plains of Dahiliyah, Jabal Akhdar is redefining tourism through a wave of youth-led initiatives that blend heritage, agriculture and enterprise.

Known for its mild summer climate and terraced farms, the wilayah is drawing visitors with projects rooted in sustainability and local identity. From eco-rest areas to restored mountain villages and olive groves, young Omanis are investing in experiences that go beyond sightseeing.

In the village of Saq, Ali bin Nasser Al Falahi has developed the Ader Rest Area in response to rising visitor numbers. Built using local stone and pine wood, the project features outdoor seating, cabins, a café and swimming pools. Fruit trees including pomegranate, grape, peach and olive surround the property.

"These heritage-based projects help strengthen community tourism and create income for artisan families and craftsmen," Al Falahi said.

In Al Suwgra, a 400-year-old abandoned village has been brought back to life by its youth. Traditional houses have been restored using gravel and wood from juniper and wild olive trees. A suspension bridge, paved

paths and signage now guide visitors through the mountain settlement.

Abdullah bin Nasser Al Sharqi said more than RO500,000 has been invested in restoration and



operations between 2020 and 2025. The village welcomed over 30,000 visitors this year and hosted more than 700 overnight guests.

"Al Suwgra proves that young

people can turn challenges into opportunities," he said. Visitors can stay in heritage lodges, join craft workshops, explore caves and hiking trails, or learn traditional farming and

sheep herding. The village also promotes stargazing and mountain climbing activities. Online booking and digital marketing have expanded its reach.

Sustainability underpins the model. Plastic use has been reduced, local labour is employed and traditional crafts revived. Tourism revenues and online sales of local products create new income streams for residents.

Agriculture is also central to the transformation. In Al Manah, a project to plant 300 olive trees under the village endowment has been launched at a cost exceeding RO62,000. Supervised by the Ministry of Endowments and Religious Affairs, the initiative is supported by Oman LNG, Bank Muscat and Galfor.

Mahmoud bin Salem Al Toubi, endowment official for the village, said the project carries environmental and economic value. High-value varieties including Koranki, Coratina and Arbequina have been selected. Production is expected to begin next year, targeting local and international markets.

Other initiatives, including the restoration of Suwgra and rose farming and distillation experiences, are strengthening Jabal Akhdar's position as a centre for sustainable agricultural tourism.

Authorities continue to prioritise the safety and security of residential neighbourhoods. ROP said it remains vigilant in monitoring such fraudulent activities.



Ancient rock art discovered in Khaboura

The Ministry of Heritage and Tourism (MHT) has announced the discovery of a new archaeological site in the Hajar Al Sina'an area of the wilayah of Khaboura in North

Batnah, featuring a collection of rock carvings and drawings dating back to ancient periods. The newly discovered site adds to the rich archaeological and cultural legacy of Oman and offers fresh insights into the lives and symbolic expressions of early inhabitants of the region.

According to the ministry, the site includes a prominent rock formation bearing carvings and drawings created using the rock-pecking technique. The depictions include animal figures, human forms and geometric symbols, reflecting the close relationship

between ancient Omanis and their surrounding natural environment across different historical eras.

The ministry stated that the discovery forms part of its ongoing efforts to document, preserve and study archaeological sites across the sultanate. Officials noted that the carvings serve as an important visual record of early human life and environmental conditions that prevailed during those periods.

Specialists are continuing archaeological and technical studies at the site while authorities undertake measures to preserve and protect the findings. The ministry said these efforts will further enhance the historical and tourism value of the site and reinforce Oman's reputation as a country with a deep-rooted and authentic cultural heritage.



ROP arrests female gang for residential robberies in Muscat

Muscat - The Royal Oman Police (ROP) has apprehended a female criminal gang of Arab nationality involved in a series of residential robberies across Muscat governorate.

According to official reports, the group employed a deceptive strategy by using begging as a professional cover to enter properties and execute their criminal plans without drawing

suspicion. The investigation revealed that the suspects targeted several homes, taking advantage of their disguise to gain proximity to private residences before carrying out the thefts.

Following a detailed operation, the police were able to identify and detain the individuals involved in the illegal activities. Legal proceedings have been initiated against the suspects as the
